The Centre for Research in Young People's Texts and Cultures (CRYTC) supports scholarly inquiry into literary, media, and other cultural texts for children and youth. Directed by the Canada Research Chair in Young People's Texts and Cultures, Mavis Reimer, with assistance from the Research Coordinator, Larissa Wodtke, the Centre provides a focus for research in the

field at the University of Winnipeg, houses the journal *Jeunesse: Young People, Texts, Cultures* (<http://jeunessejournal.ca>) facilitates the development and management of collaborative national and international research projects, hosts visiting speakers and researchers, and maintains links with other research centres in children's studies internationally.

## Researching at CRYTC

Located on the third floor of Centennial Hall, the Centre houses four faculty offices, in addition to an office for the Research Coordinator/Managing Editor of *Jeunesse*. As well, we have a multi-media Research/Meeting Room and a Research Assistant Room with three computer workstations.

CRYTC can offer you access to the library resources of the University of Winnipeg, a workspace and computer workstation, and administrative assistance from the Research Coordinator in the Centre. We ask in return that you submit a report of the work you have

completed while you are at the Centre, and that you acknowledge CRYTC and the University of Winnipeg in any publication of research undertaken here.

Visiting researchers have the opportunity to enroll in or audit any of the courses offered by the University of Winnipeg (registration fees apply). ### Banting Postdoctoral Fellowship

Banting Postdoctoral Fellowships Program is available to national and international postdoctoral researchers to develop their leadership potential and to position them for success as research leaders of tomorrow, positively contributing to Canada's economic, social and research-based growth through a research-intensive career. Each fellowship is valued at \$70,000 per year for two years.

The PDRF (\$36,500) is designed to provide research opportunities to promising recent doctoral graduates in the natural sciences and engineering, social sciences and humanities from New Zealand or the United Kingdom.
